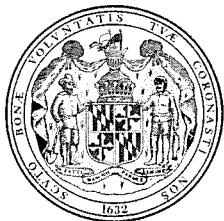

Background Information

Agency Responsibilities

The Office performs a variety of functions for the public such as filing, docketing, and maintaining various legal records; recording documents involving title to real estate; collecting the related fees, commissions, and taxes; and issuing certain licenses. In performing these functions, the Office collects funds on behalf of the State, Worcester County and its incorporated municipalities and others, and subsequently distributes the funds to the applicable entities.

Financial Information

According to the State's accounting records, the Office's fiscal year 2019 revenues totaled \$19,299,061. These revenues were distributed in the following manner:

- \$7,520,820 was distributed to Worcester County and its incorporated municipalities,
- \$16,333 was distributed to others, and
- \$11,761,908 (the remaining amount) represented revenues available to the State for purposes specified in various provisions of State law.

The Office's fiscal year 2019 operating expenses, which were paid primarily from a general fund appropriation, totaled \$2,201,953.

The Office also maintained custody of certain trust funds that, according to its records, had balances totaling \$2,076,337 as of October 31, 2019.

Findings and Recommendations

Our audit did not disclose any significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the Office's internal control. Our audit also did not disclose any significant instances of noncompliance with applicable laws, rules, or regulations. A finding that did not warrant inclusion in this report was separately communicated to the Office.

A draft copy of this report was provided to the Office. Since there are no recommendations in this report, a written response was not necessary.

Audit Scope, Objectives, and Methodology

We have conducted a fiscal compliance audit of the Office of the Clerk of Circuit Court for Worcester County, Maryland for the period beginning August 31, 2015 and ending November 17, 2019. The audit was conducted in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives.

As prescribed by the State Government Article, Section 2-1221 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the objectives of this audit were to examine the Office's financial transactions, records, and internal control, and to evaluate its compliance with applicable State laws, rules, and regulations.

In planning and conducting our audit, we focused on the major financial-related areas of operations based on assessments of significance and risk. The areas addressed by the audit included cash receipts (including taxes and fees collected for real estate transactions) and bank accounts.

Our audit did not include a review of certain support services provided to the Office by the Administrative Office of the Courts. These support services (such as payroll and invoice processing, and maintenance of budgetary accounting records) are included within the scope of our audits of the Judiciary.

To accomplish our audit objectives, our audit procedures included inquiries of appropriate personnel, inspections of documents and records, observations of the Office's operations, and tests of transactions. Generally, transactions were selected for testing based on auditor judgment, which primarily considers risk. Unless otherwise specifically indicated, neither statistical nor non-statistical audit sampling was used to select the transactions tested. Therefore, the results of the tests cannot be used to project those results to the entire population from which the test items were selected. We also performed other auditing procedures that we considered necessary to achieve our audit objectives. The reliability of data used in this report for background or informational purposes was not assessed.

The Office's management is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control. Internal control is a process designed to provide reasonable assurance that objectives pertaining to the reliability of financial records; effectiveness and efficiency of operations, including safeguarding of assets; and compliance with applicable laws, rules, and regulations are achieved.

Because of inherent limitations in internal control, errors or fraud may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projections of any evaluation of internal control to future periods are subject to the risk that conditions may change or compliance with policies and procedures may deteriorate.

Our reports are designed to assist the Maryland General Assembly in exercising its legislative oversight function and to provide constructive recommendations for improving State operations. As a result, our reports generally do not address activities we reviewed that are functioning properly.
